

Cat colony rooms cleaning

- **Spot cleaning**
 - **Cleaning with rescue:**
 - *Spray rescue into a cat hand towel if anything needs to be wiped down.*
 - **Linens:**
 - *Can be reused if not soiled. Straighten them up and place throughout the room. New blankets can also be added if needed.*
 - **Litter boxes:**
 - *Can be left in the colony room, unless overly soiled. Bring a 13gallon trash bag and a poop bag. Scoop the boxes with a poopbag and all the waste can go into the 13gallon trash bag after.*
 - *Add enough litter to cover the bottom of the litter boxes.*
 - *Make sure they are placed in the corners of the colony rooms.*
 - **Bowls**
 - *Use small flat bowls for food and the number of bowls to use is determined by how many cats are in the room. **(Ex: 5 cats in a room get 5 bowls with 1/3c each of adult cat food)** and spread them throughout the room in an area where they will not knock the bowls over.*
 - *Use bigger bowls for water. They can be placed throughout the room in an area where they will not knock the bowls over.*
 - **No sweeping or mopping is needed in the colony rooms.**
- **Deep cleaning “Colony rooms”**
 - *Remove all linens, toys, litter boxes, bowls, and Kuranda towers. **(They will not be re-used)***
 - *Spray the windows/windowsills, all the seating, and hiding holes with the rescue spray bottle. Let it sit 10mins before wiping it down.*
 - *Mop the floors and tiled walls. **(Mop Bucket: 8oz of rescue to 128oz of water)***
